Knowledge: Certainty & Contingency

- Knowledge and certainty
- Skepticism: Error, uncertainty, probability and doubt
- Forcing and foundational criteria Justification

 a priori: independent of experience, analytic, logic
 a posteriori: empirical
- Certainty and contingency
 - What is contingent versus what is certain and/or fixed
 - The level of certainty you need
 - The contingent nature of everyday life
 - Professional action and multiple contingencies

Epistemological Pluralism


- Singular epistemology and everyday life

- Knowledge, belief, desire, and faith: *Believe* is cognate with the German *belieben*, and the Latin *libido*
- Knowledge and desire/motivation: Needs, drives, interests: Marxist and psychological perspectives


Language, Discourse, Paradigms and Frames
